Six Inches of Soil tells the story of remarkable farmers, communities, small businesses, chefs, and entrepreneurs who are leading the way to transform how our food is produced and consumed through agroecology. Agroecology is an approach to farming that includes regenerative farming techniques that work in harmony with, rather than against, nature. It focuses on local food systems and shorter supply chains and aims to keep carbon in the ground to create resilient systems in the face of climate uncertainty.

On the panel afterwards, we are delighted to announce that the audience will be able to put questions to the Director, Colin Ramsay and the co-author of the book, Priya Kalia.

We really hope as many North Bedfordshire villages farmers as possible will be able to attend, to deepen the quality of discussion, despite it being at such a busy time of year.
